PHONE MONITORING

My Mobile Watchdog (\$44.95)

My Mobile Watchdog provides a complete parental control solution so that you can monitor your child's phone use, manage the features remotely, and develop a digitally responsible child.

Mobicip Safe Browser with Parental Control (Free for basic, \$39.99/year offers app monitoring)

Safe Browser is the most popular parental control app for the iPhone, iPod touch & iPad. The optional web-based dashboard allows you to monitor browsing history remotely and setup a custom internet filter across tablets, smartphones and computers.

POPULAR SITES/APPS

Instagram: a photo-sharing, video-sharing and social networking service that enables users to take pictures and videos, apply digital filters to them, and have conversations around them.

Snapchat: allows users to send a photo/video to friends that will “self-destruct” in 1-10 seconds.

Vine: 6 seconds of looping video that can be viewed from Vine or shared to Facebook/Twitter

Ask.fm: an anonymous question and answer platform website. It allows anyone to post anonymous comments and questions to a person's profile and is increasingly being used as a means to communicate abusive, bullying and sexualized content.

Yik Yak: Users can send comments anonymously. Those who see the comments don't have to have an account; they only have to be logged on. The app uses location services to bring comments to a user's feed from other users nearby.

Whisper.wh: Users share anonymous thoughts/secrets layered over an image.

Secret – Speak Freely (Secret.ly): Secrets are delivered anonymously to contacts who are on Secret. When friends “love” your secret, it will be shared with their friends.

Poof is an app that hides other apps on your phone.

You can adjust App Rating restrictions (at least for iPod, iPad and iPhone users) to prevent the download of adult-oriented apps.
